

Guidance for when 'Photography' consent is not given at Durham Scout events

You've been given this necker to be worn by a member/volunteer of your section as they've indicated in the consent process that there is no consent in place for photos / videos. Please explain this guidance to the member and help us to make this a safe event for them.

- The necker must be worn on top of any other clothing and should be as visible as possible at all times.
- When taking part in an activity that needs neckers removed, please hang the necker on the gate of the activity. This will indicate to the communications team to not take photos of that activity at that particular time.
- If your member sees that their photo or a video is being taken, they need to make the person aware that this can't be taken.
- During 'gatherings' it's key that they take a level of responsibility to stay out of photos and videos. Examples of this could include:
 - Not standing at the front during ceremonies
 - Turning their back to the camera when it points in their direction
- Neckers should be handed back in at the help desk or event control AFTER the member has left site. They must be handed to someone and the return recorded – not just left unattended.
- Failure to get the return recorded could result in an invoice being sent for £5.00 per necker.
